From Pastor Sherri

Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly!" -John 10:10b

Ash Wednesday, February 26, began the Lenten season. Lent is the 40-day period before Easter designated for reflection and building stronger relationships with God, both as individuals and communities. Ash Wednesday and Lent feature a call to repentance — a renewed turning toward God so our relationships may be genuine.

Many will be renewing their relationships with God by reading devotionals, attending special services and perhaps trying to practice more discipline in our spiritual practices. We do preparations to rid ourselves of all things....to empty ourselves in order to be filled by God in Christ. When we do this, the focus is not on our work, but the work of God in Christ Jesus.

Jesus tells his disciples and us to "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them." The word translated here as PIETY is actually "righteousness" and is the focus through Lent.

Righteousness is not an obedience to rules...but to an inward faithfulness and obedience to the *Spirit of the Love of God, Love of Neighbor*, and *Care of the Self*. Matthew's vision of LIVING WELL applies to both our private lives and to the life of the church.

Lent with this LIVING WELL series is a time when we strip away all the frills to get at the basics of what it means to be Christian. What difference does Faith make in our everyday lives?

As Presbyterians and Lutherans, the way we work on our spirituality is not through some practices we created. The practices we participate in are created by God, and IN THEM....GOD COMES TO US!

God promises to come to us in our BAPTISM.

God promises to come to us in COMMUNION.

God promises to come to us in WORSHIP.

God promises to come to us in the RIGHTLY PREACHED WORD.

LIVING WELL gives us an opportunity to connect Sundays with our everyday lives. The Sunday themes are: Financial Wellness; Intellectual Wellness; Socio-Emotional Wellness; Vocational Wellness; Physical Wellness; and what holds all of this together and undergirds our lives is our Spiritual Wellness.

One Lenten practice at TCM is to meet on Wednesdays for worship and a meal. We will again be worshipping in three regions this year with 6:00 pm worship followed by a meal in which we will connect with each other in an intentional way. *(continued on next page)*

- a. The congregation opens its doors to welcome the stranger and goes beyond its doors to share the love of Jesus Christ
- b. Creates and nurtures partnerships within the community to make a positive impact on the strength of the community

BUSINESS:

- Special meetings held February 2, 2020, in each of the seven Tri-County Ministry congregations were discussed, regarding constitutionality. Shar Gumke presented rules regarding notification, as outlined in the ELCA Constitution. Quorum requirements were also discussed.
- Special meetings held by First Presbyterian and Our Savior's of Kloten met the notification requirements, and those meetings will stand.
- Special meetings held by Trinity of Binford, Our Savior's of McHenry, Grace of Grace City, Faith of Hannaford, and Lutheran Church of McVille did not meet the notification requirements due to cancellation of worship on one of the Sundays the meeting was being announced. Additionally, Our Savior's of McHenry did not have a quorum.
- Motion by Connie Eslinger, seconded by Denny Goetz, that special meetings be rescheduled in
 the five congregations for February 23, 2020. Notice will be given on Sundays, February 9 & 16.
 If worship is cancelled on one of those Sundays, the special meetings will be moved to March 1,
 2020. If worship is cancelled for both February 9 & 16, the announcement process would begin
 again and the special meetings would be moved to March 8, 2020. Motion carried.
- Concerns were brought forward regarding finances, dwindling membership numbers, fund raising, and staffing needs.
- Vickie Goplen and Connie Eslinger volunteered to compose a letter addressing those concerns, to be read at the special congregational meetings.

Meeting adjourned with the praying of the Lord's Prayer.
