# Reflections on Confirmation for 2023-24 by Truley Trautman, SAM

Confessing My Faith theme verse: Romans 10:8A, 9, 11, 13

"The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart....because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. No one who believes in him will be put to shame. For, everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

### Confirming My Convictions theme verse: Psalm 61:1-5, 8

"Hear my cry, O God; listen to my prayer. From the end of the earth I call to you, when my heart is faint. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I; for you are my refuge, a strong tower against the enemy. Let me abide in your tent forever, find refuge under the shelter of your wings. For you, O God, have heard my vows; you have given me the heritage of those who fear your name. So I will always sing praises to your name, as I pay my vows day after day."

These are the theme verses for the 8<sup>th</sup> graders completing their year of confirmation and preparing for their service of confirmation and reaffirmation of their baptism. I think these two statements of Confessing My Faith and Confirming My Convictions are something each one of us that is a part of the community of faith needs to re-evaluate every so often in our own lives too. How are we living out our faith and convictions in our churches and our own lives?

In working with our six young people who are in confirmation this year, I have so enjoyed listening to them and learning with them during our class times together. They have been amazing to work with even when our one and a half hours of class stretch into almost two hours! They never complain and are willing to do whatever I have asked them to do. A typical class time would be: snack and talk about highs and lows for about 15 minutes, then work on two or three lessons with a specific theme and questions, and then close with about 10 minutes of meditation time in the sanctuary with a candle focusing on a reading/devotion, prayer/meditation time and then ending with blessing each other before we go. The meditation time has become a very special time for all of us to really stop and do some reflecting on what we have talked about that day and for learning to pray for others.

This year I have been using the Faith5 curriculum and we had to cover a lot of material to prepare the 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls to touch on what it means to be a believer of faith in the Lutheran church. And, because of that, we weren't always able to just talk about the questions they may have concerning their journey of faith. We have a couple more classes together, so I am hoping we can take some time to share together and learn from each other. A confirmation date has not been set yet, but will take place sometime this summer. (continued on page 2)
